- Parents as partners: inform about PTO meetings, Title 1 nights, Kindergarten round up in an organized and timely manner, and other activities that parents may request.

Washington Discovery Academy will provide the parents with timely information in a language and format easily understood in the following ways:

- Classroom Newsletters
- Report Cards
- Communication Folder
- District, School, Grade-level Social Media Pages/Websites
- Translate documents, so all families can receive information
- Title 1 meetings will be held at different times throughout the day to accommodate all parents.
- Parents will be involved in the writing, revision, and improvement of Title 1 school parent involvement policy.

If requested by the parents, the school provides opportunities for regular meetings that allow parents to participate in decisions relating to the education of their children.
